## Supply List

fat quarter of white cotton fabric

Sulky Stick 'n Stitch™ + printer (if desired for printing your patterns)

Thread Heaven (suggested for using with sewing Sulky Stick 'n Stitch)

Embroidery needle

Small embroidery scissors

mini wooden embroidery hoops (holes are 1 inch)

red/white cotton bakers twine for hanging

a strong craft glue (such as e-6000) or a hot glue gun

Sulky 12 Wt. Cotton Petite thread in these colors:

(green)51, (yellow)502, (light brown)521, (black) 1005, (white) 1082, (red) 1147, (light green) 1177, (orange) 1184, (dark brown) 1186, (blue) 1292, (grey) 1295, (variegated blue) 4014

# Stitchy Notes

Preparing your Pattern

You can print your pattern sheet directly onto Sulky Stitch' n Stitch™ if desired. Use the pattern on the last page to print onto the Stich n Stitch, then lay out the full printed sheet onto your white cotton fabric and get stitching!

If you desire to trace each pattern, I recommend Clover fine point water soluble pens. Find a bright spot and placing your pattern under your fabric, use your pen to trace. Make sure you leave a good space around each ornament for cutting out.

## FINISHING UP

After you stitch each pattern, take some white thread and using a RUNNING STITCH, stitch a circle about a half dollar size around each ornament design. Make sure to leave a good thread tail on both ends.

Take your 3 piece mini wooden embroidery hoops, and using the thicker circle, place this behind your embroidery, making sure to put your design in the center. Then pull the thread tails to gather your ornament around the wooden disc. Pull these tightly and you can knot the tails together if desired. Take your wooden ring and place that around the wrapped disc and tighten gently with a screw. Once all your designs are complete, use a good craft glue or hot glue gun to glue on the backing disc.

Use your bakers twine and cut about 10 inch lengths and run them through the screw bolt in the hoop and tie a knot to finish your ornament.



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


#### Manger

Thread colors: 502, 1186, 1292

Stitches: backstitch, seed stitch, satin stitch

- 1. Using 1186, use a backstitch to stitch the manger, making two little seed stitches underneath for the manger legs.
- 2. Outline the head and body with 1292, then use a satin stitch to fill in
- 3. Stitch the rays with one stitch per ray using 502




#### RUDOLPH

Thread colors: 521, 1005, 1147, 1186

Stitches: backstitch, satin stitch, french knot

- 1. Using 1186 stitch the top of the head with a backstitch
- 2. Stitch the antlers with a backstitch and 2 little seed stitches with 521
- 3. Make a french knot for each eye with 1005
- 4. Outline the nose with 1147 and then fill in the top half using a satin stitch with 1147 and the bottom half with 1186




## Frosty the Snowman

Thread colors: 521, 1005, 1082, 1184

Stitches: backstitch, satin stitch, seed stitch

- 1. Stitch each body oval with a backstitch using 1082.
- 2. Add two little seed stitch buttons to his belly and for his eyes with 1005
- 3. Outline his hat with a backstitch using 1005, then fill in with a satin stitch.
- 4. Use a seed stitch for his arms using 521
- 5. Use 3 little stitches to make his carrot nose using 1184




#### HOLDAY WREATH

Thread colors: 51, 1147, 1177

Stitches: lazy daisy, french knot, seed stitch

- 1. First, use 51 to sew little seed stitches all the way around the circle, then add a second layer of seed stitches with 1177
- 2. Make french knots with 1147 all the way around for the berries
- 3. Sew a lazy daisy for each loop of the bow with 1147 and add two little seed stitches coming down for the bow tails.




#### CANDY CANE

Thread colors: 1082, 1147

Stitches: backstitch, satin stitch

- 1. Outline the cane with 1082 using a backstitch.
- 2. Starting with 1082, use a satin stitch to fill in each section, alternating with 1147




## Poinsettia

Thread colors: 51, 502, 1147

Stitches: lazy daisy, french knot

- 1. Sew the four large lazy daisy loops with 1147 for the petals
- 2. Make four smaller lazy daisy loops with 51 for the leaves
- 3. Use 502 to make 3-5 little french knots in the center




#### Ornament

Thread colors: 51, 1147, 1295

Stitches: back stitch, satin stitch

- 1. Outline the circle with a backstitch using 1147
- 2. Use a satin stitch to fill in the red sections on the top and bottom with 1147
- 3. Sew 4-5 satin stitches across the middle using 51
- 4. Use a backstitch to sew the hanger and hanger top using 1295 (you can also fill in the hanger top with a satin stitch)




#### JOY

Thread colors: 51, 502, 1147

Stitches: back stitch, lazy daisy, french knot

- 1. Start by stitching the J with a backstitch using 51
- 2. Then stitch a ring of lazy daisies with 502 and finish them off with a french knot center using 1147
- 3. Finish by stitching your Y with a backstitch using 51



## Snowflake

Thread colors: 4014

Stitches: back stitch

1. Stitch the entire snowflake using a backstitch with 4014.



## Christmas Tree

Thread colors: 52, 502, 1186

Stitches: back stitch

- 1. Stitch the outline of the tree with a backstitch using 52
- 2. Use 3 little stitches to make the trunk with 1186
- 3. Sew 5 tiny stitches to make the star with 502 you could also make a simple french knot instead of the star shape
